↑AB 683	E. Garcia (D-Coachella)	Prisoners: support services – would authorize a number of counties to implement pilot programs to provide reentry services and support to persons who are being released from a county jail.	Chaptered
↑AB 790	Stone (D-Scotts Valley)	Identification cards: replacement: reduced fee – provides a reduced fee of \$8 for a replacement identification card issued to eligible inmates..	Senate Floor
↑AB 1111	E. Garcia (D-Coachella)	Removing Barriers to Employment Act: breaking barriers to employment – establishes a competitive grant program for activities to address the needs of individuals who face multiple barriers for employment opportunities.	Senate Approps Suspense
↑AB 1115	Jones-Sawyer (D-Los Angeles)	Convictions: expungement – would authorize a court, in its discretion, to grant expungement relief for a petitioner previously convicted of an offense included in AB 109, public safety realignment.	Gov's Desk
↑AB 1308	Stone (D-Scotts Valley)	Youth offender parole hearings – expands the youth offender parole process to include those who committed their crimes when they were 25 years of age or younger.	Senate Approps Suspense
↑AB 1312	Gonzalez Fletcher (D-San Diego)	Sexual assault: victims' rights – would ensure that rape kits are not destroyed prematurely, that survivors of sexual assault are aware of their rights and the resources available to them.	Senate Approps Suspense
↑AB 1384	Weber (D-San Diego)	Victims of violent crimes: trauma recovery centers – would create clear guidelines for the Trauma Recovery Center and bolster training for new trauma recovery centers.	Senate Approps Suspense

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↑AB 1448	Weber (D-San Diego)	Elderly Parole Program –would codify the existing Elderly Parole Program which allows inmates who are 60 years of age and older and have been incarcerated for at least 25 years to be reviewed by the parole board under the elderly parole guidelines.	S. Floor
↑AB 1639	E. Garcia (D-Coachella)	Crime Victims: the CA Victim Compensation Board – prohibits the California Crime Victim Compensation Board from denying an application for a claim solely because the victim or derivative victim is a person who is listed in the CalGang system.	Senate Floor
↑SB 10	Hertzberg (D-Van Nuys)	Bail reform – would reform California’s money bail system and safety reduce the number of people being held in jail awaiting trial.	Assembly Approps
↑SB 142	Beall (D-San Jose)	Criminal offenders: mental health – would provide monetary incentives for counties sending mentally ill offenders to prison and require courts to consider, if provided by probation, a defendant’s mental health history when determining sentencing and whether treatment in the community is appropriate in lieu of incarceration.	2yr bill
↑SB 190	Mitchell (D-Los Angeles)	Juveniles -- would end the harmful, unlawful and costly assessment and collection of administrative fees against families with youth in the juvenile justice system.	Assembly Floor
↑SB 336	Anderson (R-Alpine)	Exonerated inmates: transitional services –would update the standard for eligibility for services to wrongfully convicted people so that they can receive services consistent with the change in current law.	Assembly Floor
